Thanks to this tremendous outpouring of love, we're moving forward with confidence as we introduce the Caste Equality Project (CEP) in Saptari District.

Our CEP Coordinator, Lalit Gahatraj, is now assembling the local team who will put our plans into action, improving education resources for hundreds of girls and boys, restoring little ones to health with nutritious meals and caregiver workshops, and training young adults in the skilled trades that will improve building safety in their area.

Over 30 years ago, when I first founded NYF, I could not have imagined such an ambitious program. Now, as we stride into our next major endeavor, the Caste Equality Project fills me with special satisfaction. Our Nepali experts are exactly the right team to lead and nurture this complex work-with all the best experience, know-how, and love.

And there are more exciting summer developments!

- Thanks to a generous family foundation, our Nutrition team has a new all-terrain SUV that will serve as a mobile nursing clinic. This vehicle will bring Nutrition Outreach Camps into more remote, difficult-to-reach areas of Nepal, and will transport critically malnourished kids to Nutritional Rehabilitation Homes. It will also allow us to lengthen some of these camps and to leave small teams in villages for additional one-on-one training time.
- And our New Life Center now has an expanded mission. The rates of mother-to-child HIV transmission in Nepal have fallen so successfully that we are now offering services to children visiting Kathmandu for any critical medical services-not just HIV.

Many families bring their kids for urgent medical care in Kathmandu with no way to afford accommodations during their visit. The NLC is now serving as a safe facility where they can stay with their sick children as they navigate the Nepali health care system. (Read more about this at https://nyf.news/expanded-mission!)

NYF's community of supporters—you!—have made it all possible since the beginning. I can't tell you what it means to the families we serve when they learn our projects are funded by faraway people who love the children of Nepal and want to share opportunities with them. They are so grateful to all of you, and so am I.

Staff Spotlight: Laxmi Ghimire Career Counselor & VECC Program Manager

In July 2014, Laxmi Ghimire left a solid but unfulfilling job at a Kathmandu IT company to join the Vocational Education & Career Counseling team at NYF.

"I took a risk," she says. "But it was wonderful taking a risk." Laxmi has been on the NYF team ever since. She is now both a Career Counselor and the VECC Program Manager, and she has added a Master's in Technical Education & Vocational Training to her qualifications.

Laxmi matches young adults with careers that allow them to reach their unique goals. Her work emphasizes technical education, but sometimes these programs are stepping-stones for students in special circumstances.

For example, Jivan* wanted a career in government, to improve conditions for rural villages like his. He put himself all the way through a master's degree in sociology—but was unable to find work.

Jivan became a migrant laborer in Saudi Arabia, but after two years of terrible conditions, he realized he preferred being unemployed in Nepal over remaining stuck where he was.

Fortunately, soon after returning to Nepal he attended an Olgapuri Vocational School (OVS) presentation in his area. He thought if he completed a vocational training course, he'd at least be able to take on skilled work, even if he wasn't using his degree.

After completing NYF's three-month electrical certification, he found a solid job that covered not only his basic expenses, but also a government prep course that he hoped would finally open the door to his dream.

For 11 months, Jivan performed electrical work fulltime by day and attended evening classes. He is now

"When [young adults] come to the training, they come with lots of dreams," Laxmi says. "It's a short-term training, but they come with big dreams. That's a wonderful part of my job. That is the best part, I think." an officer in the Nepali government. His nontraditional career path helps him understand the plight of so many others throughout his country.

This impact story is unusual. Most OVS grads stick with their new vocational trades, building thriving small businesses back home, establishing themselves in a 9-5 job in one of Nepal's cities, or using their new skill as an extra source of income when they're not needed on the family farm. No matter what path each graduate takes, the positive impact on their life trajectory far exceeds the cost of the training.

Laxmi loves watching prospective students begin connecting the dots between one of our three-month

courses and the chance to build forward with power. During orientation presentations, she scans the crowd for "hopeful eyes"—the moment it dawns on someone that they've found a viable, expansive path.

Laxmi wishes all of NYF's generous supporters could witness each of these transformations. "Just a small donation makes a big transformation," she says. "A big change in somebody's life. It's something beyond satisfaction."

Unexpected success with mobile, "satellite" training courses during the COVID-19 pandemic has expanded this impact even more. There's now a waiting list of rural municipalities requesting these courses, especially plumbing and electrical trainings. The presence of locally based plumbers and electricians instantly makes both amenities much more affordable and accessible to these communities, drastically improving the quality of life for everyone.

Families in Saptari District who have already seen the transformative impact of our nutrition program on their children will give special thanks for the knowledge that is




